Rector's Message



Dear parishioners and friends, throughout our diocese this weekend, the church celebrates 'Ministry Sunday'. It offers all of us to reflect upon the call given in baptism to follow the Lord and to use our gifts as members of St. John's for doing God's work in the world. We also pray that the Lord will continue to call men and women into ordained ministry and we remember all those who are following this call.

We welcome Helen Chandler as our preacher today. Helen is a parishioner of St. John's who is discerning a call to ordained ministry. The parish has recently written a Letter to the Bishop commending her for moving forward along the journey. We continue to offer Helen our prayer and support.

The parish over the next several months will also be considering whether we might wish to raise up local priests, who are non stipendiary, and who offer ministry in a local parish. In the future we will have the Director of the Non Stipendiary Ministry Program come and speak with us.

In today's Gospel, Jesus risks speaking the truth in his home town and as a result, faces rejection. The Lord continues to raise up for Prophets Like Himself. We know we are willing to listen to people as long as they tell us what pleases us, what conforms to our own ways of thinking. If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful

or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of heaven and earth; by water and the Holy Spirit you have made us a holy people in Jesus Christ our Lord; you renew that mystery in bread and wine and nourish us, to show forth your glory in all the world. We praise you Lord, with all the angels, in their song of joy.

We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world.

In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life. On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith. *(Sung)*

**Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.
Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.**

So we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine. We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever. *People Amen. (Sung)*

The Lord's Prayer

The Breaking of the Bread

The celebrant breaks the consecrated bread for distribution, and says:

"I am the bread of life," says the Lord. "Whoever comes to me will never be hungry; whoever believes in me will never thirst."
**All Taste and see that the Lord is good;
happy are they who trust in him!**

The celebrant invites the people to share in communion and says,

The gifts of God for the People of God.

All **Thanks be to God.**

**Jesus Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world,
have mercy on us.**

**Jesus Bread of life, you take away the sin of the world,
have mercy on us.**

**Jesus Prince of Peace you take away the sin of the world,
have mercy on us.**

**Jesus Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world,
grant us your peace.**

The celebrant and people then receive communion.

The body of Christ (given for you). The blood of Christ (shed for you).

The communicant responds each time, **Amen.**

This community of faith,
welcomes to the Lord's table
all who are baptized and who wish to be nourished
with the Body and Blood of Christ.

STORIES FROM THE RICH PAST OF OUR PARISH

It was no fun being a Warden in the 19th. Century. John Creighton, a Warden was buried on June 6, 1826. He was the Lt. Col. of the Militia and Judge of the Inferior Court. He had been a Church Warden in 1811. In those days a committee of the Vestry assessed each family a Levy to support the Church. It was recorded that this warden was not a good collector and was 37 Pounds and 11 Shillings in arrears.. As a result the Vestry proposed in suing for the sum, even after the gentleman died.

I regret that there has not been an historical note in recent months. My health has not been good, however, it has improved and this item will again appear.
