Dear parishioners and friends,

## The Proclamation of the Word

### A READING FROM THE BOOK OF EXODUS

Moses came down from Mount Sinai. As he came down from the mountain with the two tablets of the covenant in his hand, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, the skin of his face was shining, and they were afraid to come near him. But Moses called to them; and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses spoke with them. Afterward all the Israelites came near, and he gave them in commandment all that the Lord had spoken with him on Mount Sinai. ## **A READING FROM THE SECOND LETTER OF PAUL TO THE CORINTHIANS**

Since, then, we have such a hope, we act with great boldness, not like Moses, who put a veil over his face to keep the people of Israel from gazing at the end of the glory that was being set aside. But their minds were hardened. Indeed, to this very day, when they hear the reading of the old covenant, that same veil is still there, since only in Christ is it set aside. Indeed, to this very day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their minds; but when one turns to the Lord, the veil is removed. Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit. Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart. We have renounced the shameful things that one hides; we refuse to practise cunning or to falsify God's word; but by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God. *2 CORINTHIANS 3:12-4:2*

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith. *(Sung)*

So we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine. We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever. *People* **Amen.** (*Sung*)

**Next Sunday Canadian soprano Suzie LeBlanc will be our guest at the 10:30 worship service.**

The **Chapel Choir of the University of King's College**, under the direction of five-time Grammy winner **Paul Halley**, will present **J S Bach's** magnificent **St John Passion** on **Friday, March 19th at St John's Anglican Church, Lunenburg**, and on **Sunday, March 21st at the Cathedral Church of All Saints, Halifax**. These performances will feature a line-up of stellar soloists, including Suzie LeBlanc, Sarah Myatt, Andrew Pickett, David Menzies, Martin Auclair and Bruce Fifer, as well as the chamber orchestra *Ensemble Regale*, led by David Greenberg.

"The St John Passion is possibly Bach's most intense and dramatic work. He was clearly deeply moved by the texts, not only of the Gospel narration, but of the arias, chorales and choruses that comment on the unfolding events of the Passion. The profound effect of these words on the composer resulted in music of enormous power and poignancy," explains Paul Halley. The performance will be sung in German in order to retain the immediacy and dramatic impact of the text.

**STORIES FROM THE RICH PAST OF OUR PARISH**

*Last week our story was an article on our chimers.*

*This week I have found the Will of Ada Kaulbach and it relates to the Chimes.*

Clause two of the will of Ada S. Kaulbach, Trustee: Royal Trust Company:

I give and bequeath to my trustee herein after named, the sum of one thousand dollars to be invested in trust funds authorized by the Province of Nova Scotia, and direct that the annual income therefrom shall be first used for the repair and maintenance in first class condition of the chime of ten chimes and all apparatus given by my late husband to St. John's Episcopal Church of Lunenburg, and any balance remaining over shall be used as seen fit by my trustee for the maintenance of the Kaulbach Family Cemetery Lot in the Town of Lunenburg. My Trustee shall select and appoint a competent inspector in Lunenburg, other than the chimer, who shall go to the belfry once a year, during his term of office and make a thorough inspection of the bells and all apparatus, and report in writing to my trustee, and such an inspector shall receive a fee not more than five dollars for each said visit and report in writing to my trustee. My trustee shall have the power and authority to dismiss the inspector and to appoint a successor without being obliged to assign causes for any such a dismissal. He will make a new appointment and not be held liable in any action for dismissal of inspectors. *One would not get wealthy by being a chime inspector....*
