## The Gathering of the Community

All Alleluia! Christ is risen.  
**The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia!**

## The Collect

As we share your own love, make it reliable and lasting like yours, ever respectful of people, always inventive and new, and reaching out especially to the poor and the unloved. We ask this in the name of Jesus the Lord. **Amen.**

## The Proclamation of the Word

### A READING FROM THE BOOK OF ACTS

Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?"

Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' But I replied, 'By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.'

This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life." **ACTS 11:1-18**

## Non Stipendiary Ordained Ministry - NSOM

Parishes in the Diocese of Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island are served by a Rector licenced by the Bishop. Rectors are ordained, full-time priests who have a professional education and training for ministry. They receive a stipend from the parish for the ministry provided.

Other forms of ordained ministry are found in our diocese. These ministries arise from within parishes and communities to assist the Rector and lay ministries of the parish. These ordained ministries take the form of Non Stipendiary deacons and priests. Non Stipendiary means that the individuals are self-supporting and not paid for their ministry. Deacons primarily minister beyond the walls of the church, as it were, serving needs of the community, interfacing between the parish and community. They also can serve within the parish visiting the sick, leading programs and assisting with liturgy. Non Stipendiary priests are also known as associate priests and support the ministry of the Rector and other lay ministries. They can carry out all the usual ministries of a priest. Like parish rectors, NSOM deacons and priests enter into a Covenant in Ministry with the Parish and Rector in which they serve.

St. John's Parish, Lunenburg, is a large, multi-faceted parish with a variety of ministries, programs and a robust worship schedule. We are invited to enter a discussion about our lay and ordained ministries in the parish and the kind of ordained ministry we envision to meet our needs. Some things for us to consider are: Can we envision having NSOM ministry within the parish? How would NSOM enhance the overall ministry of the parish? How would it complement and support the ministry of the Rector? Is the ministry of the Rector with an Honorary Associate and occasional help from retired clergy sufficient?

Let us pray for wisdom and understanding as we enter this discussion, remaining open to the leading of the Holy Spirit.
