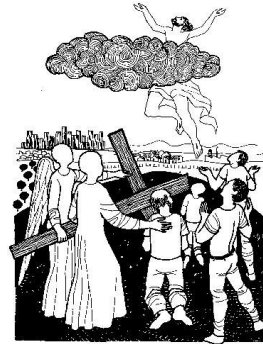

Rector's Message



“And behold I am sending the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high.” Jesus Christ - Luke 24

Friends, when someone good and close to us has died, we feel that this person is still with us and keeps inspiring and guiding us. When at his Ascension Jesus left his disciples and passed to the glory of heaven, he became to his disciples more than a memory of a great person who had died. First, he is still alive as the Risen Lord; second, he is gone but he stays with us by his Spirit of strength, wisdom, and love and in this way he is our companion in life. He still speaks his Word to us, he still gives himself to us as our food and drink, and he is alive in our communities.

The Proclamation of the Word

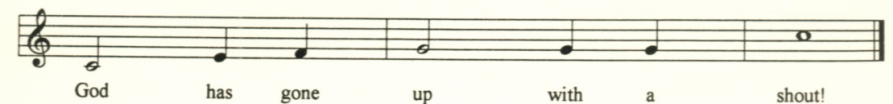
A READING FROM THE BOOK OF ACTS

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

The Gospel

Sermon

The Celebration of Baptism

Presentation and Examination of the Candidates

The celebrant says,

I invite the families of the candidates for Holy Baptism to now stand.

Then the candidate is presented by the parents and sponsors, saying,

I present N to receive the sacrament of baptism.

Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is nurtured in the faith and life of the Christian community?

Parents and sponsors, I will, with God's help.

Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents and sponsors, I will, with God's help.

Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God? **I renounce them.**

Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God? **I renounce them.**

Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God? **I renounce them.**

Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour? **I do.**

Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love? **I do.**

Do you promise to obey him as your Lord? **I do.**

The celebrant addresses the congregation, saying,

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ? *People* **We will.**

Prayers for the Candidates

The celebrant then says to the congregation,

Let us now pray for those who are to receive the sacrament of new birth.

Deliver them O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

Lord, hear our prayer.

Open their hearts to your grace and truth.

Lord, hear our prayer.

Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

Lord, hear our prayer.

Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit.

Lord, hear our prayer.

Send them into the world in witness to your love.

Lord, hear our prayer.

Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory.

Lord, hear our prayer.

Other prayers for the world, the church and the congregation may be added.

The leader concludes,

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. **Amen.**

THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

Celebrant The Lord be with you. *People* **And also with you.**

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Celebrant We give you thanks, almighty God and Father, for by the gift of water you nourish and sustain all living things.

All **Blessed be God for ever.**

Celebrant We give you thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea, you led your people out of slavery to freedom in the promised land.

All **Blessed be God for ever.**

Celebrant We give you thanks for sending your Son Jesus. For us he was baptized by John in the river Jordan. For us he was anointed as Christ by your Holy Spirit. For us he suffered the baptism of his own death and resurrection, setting us free from the bondage of sin and death, and opening to us the joy and freedom of everlasting life.

All **Blessed be God for ever.**

Celebrant We give you thanks for your Holy Spirit who teaches us and leads us into all truth, filling us with his gifts so that we might proclaim the gospel to all nations and serve you as a royal priesthood.

All **Blessed be God for ever.**

Celebrant We give you thanks for you have called N to new life through the waters of baptism.

Now sanctify this water, that your servants who are washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection, to be cleansed and delivered from all sin. Anoint them with your Holy Spirit and bring them to new birth in the family of your Church, that they may become inheritors of your glorious kingdom. We give you praise and honour and worship through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and for ever.

All **Blessed are you, our strength and song, and our salvation.**

The Baptismal Covenant

Let us renew the vows of our own baptism.

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Father?

People **I believe in God, The Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Celebrant Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead.**

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People **I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

Celebrant Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People **I will, with God's help.**

The Baptism

The candidate is presented by name to the celebrant, who then immerses, or pours water upon each candidate, saying,

N, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The celebrant makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each one using holy chrism oil, saying to each,

N, I sign you with the cross + and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

The celebrant and family proceed to the chancel, where the newly baptized is presented to the congregation with the following prayer.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon *these your servants* the forgiveness of sin, and have raised *them* to the new life of grace.

Sustain *them*, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit.

Give *them* an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

The Giving of the Light

The newly baptized are presented with a lighted candle, saying,

Celebrant Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

Celebrant Let us welcome the newly baptized.
People **We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**

The Peace *All stand, and the celebrant addresses the people.*
The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People **And also with you.** *We greet one another in the name of the Lord.*

The Celebration of the Eucharist

The Preparation of the Gifts

Representatives of the parish present the gifts of bread and wine for the Eucharist. Each one as they are able, makes an offering to the Lord for the needs and responsibilities of the Church to be placed on the altar.

The Prayer over the Gifts *Read by celebrant.*

Lord our God, in the signs of this bread and this wine your Son Jesus is with us yet. May we rather face the world and commit ourselves to the task of building your Kingdom, by the power of the Spirit of Jesus Christ, your Son and our Lord for ever. **Amen.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Preface for the Ascension

Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of heaven and earth; we give you thanks and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, who after his glorious resurrection appeared to his disciples, and in their sight ascended into heaven to prepare a place for us; that where he is, there we might also be, and reign with him in glory. We praise you Lord, with all the angels, in their song of joy.

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest. Hosanna in the highest.

Holy and gracious God, accept our praise, through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ; who on the night he was handed over to suffering and death, took bread and gave you thanks, saying,

*"Take, and eat: this is my body which is broken for you."
In the same way he took the cup of wine, saying,
"This is my blood which is shed for you.
When you do this, you do it in memory of me."*

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith.
Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Remembering, therefore, his death and resurrection, we offer you this bread and this cup, giving thanks that you have made us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

We ask you to send your Holy Spirit upon the offering of your holy Church.

Gather into one all who share in these sacred mysteries, filling them with the Holy Spirit and confirming their faith in the truth, that together we may praise you and give you glory through your Servant, Jesus Christ, by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Lord's Prayer

The Lord Jesus is now living in the glory of the Father in heaven; there he pleads for us. Through him, and in his words, we pray to God, our Father:

**Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world,

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world,
grant us your peace.**

*The celebrant and people receive communion.
The body of Christ (given for you).
The blood of Christ (shed for you).
Or The body of Christ, the bread of heaven.
The blood of Christ, the cup of salvation.
The communicant responds each time, **Amen.***

This community of faith, welcomes to the Lord's table
all who are baptized and who wish to be nourished
with the Body and Blood of Christ.

STORIES FROM THE RICH PAST OF OUR PARISH

Early History Of The Towers

The first mention of a tower was in correspondence between Rev. J.B. Moreau and Governor Lawrence. The Governor was displeased with the speed at which the Church was being constructed. Moreau replied that it was proceeding well and the parishioners had agreed to construct a tower suitable to house a bell weighing two hundred weight, to be donated by Admiral Boscawen.

The next mention of a bell is a bequest by D.C. Jessen in 1814 at which time he left the Church a communion set and a bell. If Boscawen's bell had been received it is unlikely that another would have been required at such an early date. It is interesting to note that the Jessen bell was used until the fire of 2001 and today sits on a plinth in the church square.

The tower was in very poor shape by 1840 and either repairs or replacement was needed. W.N.B. Lawson, teacher at the National School, Lunenburg was asked to design a tower which measured 70 ft. high and 16 by 16 ft. at the base. The tower provided stairs leading to the balconies which extended and south sides of the building. It was also possible to extend the singing pews which accommodated the choir in the balcony at the rear of the church. A vestry was also built in the tower. The structure made it possible to provide 15 extra pews which could accommodate 75 people.

The corner stone of this tower was of considerable interest as it contained various coins and historical papers. These papers were thought to be very rare but copies do exist in the Public Archives of Nova Scotia, There is no idea where this stone was laid or what happened to it in subsequent towers.
